By COUNCIL MEMBER PEOPLES:

WHEREAS, The South African regime has adopted a constitution that only provides partial representation of Asians and Indians, and

WHEREAS, The constitution totally ignored the rights of the black majority of South Africa, providing no representation or civil rights, and

entire United Nations general assembly the constitution was denounced by
all the nations of the world except for

WHEREAS, The House and Senate

WHEREAS, The White House administration is seeking to remove provisions imposing new sanctions on South Africa, and

WHEREAS, The sanctions include provisions that would ban new American bank loans to South African government (presently current loans are approaching 5 billion dollars) and companies it owns, and set new constraints on American corporate involvement in South Africa, and

WHEREAS, The Detroit City Council has adopted numerous resolutions condemning the racist Pretoria Government and its apartheid policies, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, That the Detroit City Council implores its Senate and House Representatives to support some form of South African sanctions provisions when the Export Administration Act is finally adopted, and be it finally RESOLVED. That the City Clerk send

RESOLVED. That the City Clerk send copies of this resolution to our Washington Representatives.
