Thank you for your December 4 letter, cosigned by 29 of your colleagues, urging the President to meet with Nobel Peace Prize winner, Bishop Desmond Tutu.

As the President indicated following their visit, they had a good meeting which afforded them the opportunity to exchange information on the situation in South Africa.
