A BILL

To amend the Sugar Act of 1948 to terminate the quota for South Africa.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That Congress hereby finds that it is not in the interest of
- 4 the United States to provide official support in any form
- 5 to a country whose racial policies are anathema to the con-
- 6 science of the world and have been so denominated by the
- 7 United Nations, and that the Republic of South Africa, hav-
- 8 ing adopted such policies, should therefore not enjoy the
- 9 privilege and benefit of a quota under the Sugar Act of 1948.

	"South Africa
3	SEC. 3. A quantity of sugar equal to the amount of the
4	quota withdrawn from South Africa shall be prorated in the
5	same manner as deficits are prorated under section 204 of the
6	Sugar Act of 1948.
