

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS URGED TO CONSIDER BLACK CAUCUS/OBERLIN COLLEGE REFERRAL PROGRAM

The Congressional Black Caucus/Oberlin College Referral Program is seeking eligible minority students for admission, according to Representative Augustus F. Hawkins (D-Calif.).

The program design calls for the acceptance of at least fifty-two students, each nominated from one of the sixteen Black Congressional districts in the nation.

"I believe that there are many young people in the 21st Congressional District, who can qualify for this unique and challenging program," said Hawkins. "It is a great op-

portunity for any student pursuing academic programs."

Among the requirements for application, an applicant must be of a minority group which is substantially educationally disadvantaged and racially or culturally removed from the "mainstream" of American Society. The applicant must have received, or be expected to receive, a high school diploma prior to the proposed date of enrollment.

Oberlin College is a coeducational liberal arts college located in Oberlin, Ohio, approximately 35 miles from Cleveland. It is considered one of the nations important colleges and enjoys a high academic reputation.
