

MANDELA FREEDOM RESOLUTION

MR. SPEAKER, I RISE IN SUPPORT OF H. CON. RES. 430, WHICH WOULD MAKE IT THE SENSE OF THE CONGRESS THAT THE SOUTH AFRICAN GOVERNMENT SHOULD IMMEDIATELY RELEASE MR. NELSON MANDELA AND HIS WIFE, MRS. WINNIE MANDELA, FROM THEIR TWENTY YEARS PLUS OF INCARCERATION FOR THEIR DETERMINED AND CONTINUED OPOSITION TO THE RACIST POLICIES OF APARTHEID.
