

Preparing a Display Label Worksheet for Teachers

When preparing a display label about a person, place or object, the description or text should be brief. The average label in a museum is between 50-200 words, allowing the viewer to learn quickly what the person or object is about and is able to spend more time looking. Below is a sample label that you can use with your students to prepare labels for their display of the current African-American women who are serving in Congress. Students can use construction or colored papers to print their labels that will accompany an image of the Congresswoman.
